Rushmore Family Collection, 1811-1997

Thomas Rushmore (died c.1682), a Quaker, arrived on Long Island from Wales in 1658. He joined four Englishmen and three Dutchmen in making an alliance for land with five Long Island Native American tribes. He married Martha Hicks in Hempstead, N.Y., in 1659 and started a dairy farm near the intersection of Old Westbury Road and Whitney Lane in Old Westbury, N.Y. Five subsequent generations of Rushmores went on to run the farm at this location. They intermarried with members of some of Long Island's most notable families, including the Townsend, Hicks, Titus, Valentine, Post, Willets, and Willits families.

When the Long Island Rail Road branched out to Oyster Bay, N.Y., the Rushmores decided to sell the Old Westbury farm and buy land closer to the railroad. (This would make it easier for them to ship their product to market.) In 1845, Thomas Rushmore (1799-1878) and Jane (Valentine) Rushmore (1806-1896) bought 150 acres of land in Roslyn, N.Y. (Today, most of this land is part of the grounds of the Roslyn Country Club in Roslyn Heights, N.Y.) On a portion of this land they built several farm buildings and a farm house, which in the early 1900s became one of the first homes on Long Island to have an indoor bathroom with running water. The Rushmores dairy farmed on this land until the late 1800s when, due to a number of factors (i.e., labor costs competition from upstate New York farms, etc.), their business started to decline. It was at this point in time that they decided to switch to growing potatoes, sweet corn, and root crops.

In the early 20th century, Leon A. Rushmore Sr. (1883-1976) worked the farm with his father and brothers, and later ran it with his brother Halstead Rushmore (1881-1929). Eventually, the farm came entirely under Leon Sr.'s leadership. He lived with his wife, Mary Willets Seaman (1881-1969), and their two sons, Leon A. Rushmore Jr. (1910-2001) and Robert S. Rushmore (b.1914), in a house that he built on Roslyn Road, in Roslyn Heights. Like Leon Sr., Mary was a graduate of Friends Academy in Locust Valley, N.Y. Included among the well known Long Island families she descended from are the Jacksons and the Underhills. She was also a direct descendant of notable Long Islanders Capt. John Seaman and Quaker preacher Elias Hicks. Several generations of her Seaman family ancestors lived in Jericho, N.Y., in a house that was a stop on the Underground Railroad and that later became the Maine Maid Inn. Mary and her family lived in Jericho until 1890 when they moved to Glen Cove, N.Y.

As a result of a real estate boom in the 1920s, western Nassau County entered a period of population growth that would last for quite some time and that lead to an increase in land values and a corresponding rise in property taxes. These increases resulted in a cut to the farmers' profits and very few of them wound up surviving the Great Depression. In an effort to keep their business viable, Leon Sr. and his sons came up with the idea of selling produce directly to the public at retail, but still at a cost slightly below that of area supermarkets. They opened three farm stands, known as Rushmore Farms, and they were able to save their farm and operate it profitably for many years.

In 1931, Leon A. Rushmore Jr. married his Swarthmore College sweetheart, Caroline A. "Carly" Jackson (1909-2007), of Philadelphia, PA. They moved into the farm house in Roslyn

Heights in 1932, it having been unoccupied since Leon Jr.'s grandfather, Stephen T. Rushmore, died in 1926. With the birth of their three children, Mary Lee (1934-), Carly (Rushmore) Hellen, (1935-), and Stephen (1945-), the farm house sprang back to life. Leon Jr. and his family would continue living at the farm house until the property was sold to Levitt & Sons in the late 1940s. Levitt & Sons were land developers who became famous for quickly and inexpensively meeting the housing needs of G.I's returning from World War II.

After the farm was sold, Leon Jr. moved his family to nearby East Williston, N.Y. He continued working at the Long Island Lighting Company (LILCO), as he done all the while he was helping to operate the family farm. He was promoted to vice president of corporate services in 1966, and later retired in 1975 after 44 years of service. (By this time he and his wife, Carly, were living in Flower Hill, N.Y.) Besides working at LILCO, Leon Jr. gave freely of his time to numerous groups and organizations, including the Westbury Monthly Meeting (Society of Friends), Westbury Friends School, Planned Parenthood, Nassau-Suffolk Hospital Council, Friends for Long Island's Heritage, and Winthrop University Hospital (formerly Nassau Hospital). In 1994, Winthrop University Hospital dedicated the Leon A. Rushmore Jr. Bridge in his honor. He died in December 2001 at the age of 91.

Caroline A. "Carly" (Jackson) Rushmore was also extremely generous with her time. Among other things, she served on the East Williston Public School Board and the board of Friends Academy; she was president of the Nassau Tuberculosis & Respiratory Disease Association; she served as a board member of the American Lung Association of Nassau-Suffolk (formerly the TB Association); and she volunteered with the Nassau Heart Association. She passed away in April 2007 at age 97.

Leon Rushmore Sr. remained living in his house on Roslyn Road with his wife, Mary. He continued to work at Roslyn Savings Bank where he had worked while also operating the family farm. He was a vice president when he was elected trustee emeritus in 1973; he retired in 1974 after 52 years of service. Aside from operating the farm and working at the bank, Leon Sr. also served on the East Williston Board of Education; was one of the founders of the Nassau Farm and Home Bureau and Four H Clubs; and was an influential member of the Long Island Farmer's Club. Without the support of the Long Island Farmer's Club, the struggling agricultural college at Farmingdale (now known as Farmingdale State) might not have survived the 1920s. Leon Sr. died in 1976 at the age of 93, his wife having pre-deceased him in 1969.

This collection spans the years 1811-1997, and includes account books, autograph books, genealogies, guest books, letters, manuscripts, maps, news clippings, notebooks, notes, photo albums (including cartes de visite albums), photographs, postcards, printed materials, publications, school papers, scrapbooks, typescripts, and videotapes.

Particularly noteworthy is the large collection of photographs, the majority of which are portraits of individual family members. Along with documenting family history, many of these photographs are interesting in that they represent a number of different early photographic formats, including ambrotypes, cabinet cards, cartes de visite, daguerreotypes, and tintypes. There are also a number of interesting "farm photographs" taken by Clarence A. Purchase, a

professional photographer. Purchase took these photos and sold them to farm journals to use as cover pictures. Also worthy of mention is a photograph of the locomotive that pulled the first passenger train into the Oyster Bay train station in 1889. The photo was taken on that first day by Robert Seaman, who was a passenger on the train.

Other notable materials include the genealogical information compiled by Samuel J. Seaman Sr., and a small group of poignant letters written to Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore from Anna Smith, whose son, Morrell, had stayed with the Rushmores at one time. Morrell Smith was listed as “missing in action” during World War I, and later was presumed to have been killed by German troops.

Index of Individuals Represented in the Collection.

Index notes:

- The collection includes a small number of cartes de visite of celebrity and historical figures. These individuals are not listed in this index, but they can be found in the alphabetical list of images in the “Photographs” series.
- Women represented in the collection both before and after they were married are listed by their married names. (Their maiden names appear in parentheses.) Note: after marriage, some women replaced their middle names with their maiden names. However, for the purposes of this index/finding aid, these women’s complete names (including middle names) are given when available. For example, after marrying Leon A. Rushmore, Sr., Mary Willets Seaman became known as “Mary Seaman Rushmore.” In this index/finding aid, however, she is listed as “Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.”
- Wherever possible, attempts have been made to indicate the relationships between more recent family members and their ancestors.

Albertson, John Augustus – born 1850; died 1923. Son of Richard Albertson (1810-1879) and Phebe W. Prior (1824-1902). His sisters were Sarah (Albertson) Skillen (1845-1909); Emma (Albertson) Underhill (1853-1937), who married Samuel J. Underhill (1848-1910); Ella (Albertson) Jackson (1863-1952), who married Jacob Willets Jackson; and Gulielma (Albertson) Freeman (b.1855). He married Mary Willis (1866-1916) in 1888 and they had two children, Ethel Mary Albertson (b.1890) and A. Raymond Albertson (b.1892).

Albertson, Mary – possibly the Mary Albertson who was born in 1848; date of death unknown. Daughter of Benjamin Albertson (b.1823) and Elizabeth Jackson (1828-1854).

Albertson, Phebe W. (Prior) - born in Westbury, N.Y., in 1824; died there in 1902. Daughter of John Prior (1787-1860) and Elizabeth Frost (1799-1862). Her siblings were Philemon Prior (1821-1867), John Augustus Prior (1826-1885), Sarah F. (Prior) Halstead Mitchell (1829-1906), Henrietta (Prior) Vanden Burg (1831-1884), and James M. Prior (1835-1857). She married Richard Albertson (1810-1879) in 1844 and they had seven children: Sarah Elizabeth (Albertson) Skillen (1845-1909); Benjamin H. Albertson (1848-1872); John Augustus Albertson (1850-1921); Emma (Albertson) Underhill (1853-1937), who married Samuel J. Underhill (1848-1910); Gulielma (Albertson) Freeman (b.1855); Richard Albertson (1859-1860), and Ella (Albertson) Jackson (1863-1952).

Augustus, Prior – born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Barbetta, Jeff – born at Rochester, N.Y., in 1973. Son of Angelo Barbetta (1945-) and Sara “Sally” Elizabeth Rushmore (1944-). Grand nephew of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr.

Barbetta, Laura Mary – born at Rochester, N.Y., in 1976. Daughter of Angelo Barbetta (1945-) and Sara “Sally” Elizabeth Rushmore (1944-). Grand niece of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr.

Barbetta, Sara “Sally” Elizabeth (Rushmore) - born at Roslyn Heights, N.Y., in 1944. Daughter of Robert Seaman Rushmore (b.1914) and Elizabeth Van Sickelen Dunkerton (1914-1944). Graduate of Friends Academy and Elmira College. She married Angelo Barbetta (1945-) in 1970; they have two children: Jeffrey Barbetta (1973-) and Laura Mary Barbetta (1976-). Resides in Penfield, N.Y. Note: Robert Seaman Rushmore married (second) Margaret Marie Hill in 1946. Niece of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr.

Barker, Sarah (Willets) – born c. 1820s; date of death unknown. Daughter of Valentine Willets (1797-1895) and Jane Rushmore (b.1796), great aunt of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. Her sisters were Letitia (Willets) Allis (b.1818), Phebe Rushmore (Willets) Underhill (b.1824), and Mary (Willets) Thomas (born c.1820s).

(Beebe family note: a common alternate spelling is “Beebe.”)

Beebe, Helen – born c.1884; date of death unknown. Granddaughter of Daniel Quimby Mitchell and Sarah F. Mitchell (1829-1906). Sarah Mitchell’s maiden name was Sarah Frost Prior. She married (first) Henry P. Halstead (d.1850) and they had one daughter, Adelaide T. (Halstead) Rushmore (b.1849), who was the mother of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. (1883-1976). Sarah married (second) Daniel Quimby Mitchell; he had three daughters—Addie, Jennie, and Marianna—from his first marriage, which was to Henry P. Halstead’s sister. Daniel and Sarah had three children: Henry Mitchell (b.1854), Henrietta (Mitchell) Beebe (b.1859), and Caroline Beebe (b.1863). Henrietta and Dr. J.H. Beebe were married in 1886 and they had at least three children: Helen (Beebe) Prouty (born c.1884), Alexander Mitchell Beebe (b.1892), and Sarah Katharine Beebe (born c.1890s).

Beebe, Alexander Mitchell – born 1892; date of death unknown. Grandson of Daniel Quimby Mitchell and Sarah F. Mitchell (1829-1906). Sarah Mitchell’s maiden name was Sarah Frost Prior. She married (first) Henry P. Halstead (d.1850) and they had one daughter, Adelaide T. (Halstead) Rushmore (b.1849), who was the mother of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. (1883-1976). Sarah married (second) Daniel Quimby Mitchell; he had three daughters—Addie, Jennie, and Marianna—from his first marriage, which was to Henry P. Halstead’s sister. Daniel and Sarah had three children: Henry (b.1854), Henrietta (b.1859), and Caroline (b.1863). Henrietta married Dr. J.H. Beebe in 1886 and they had at least three children: Helen (Beebe) Prouty (born c.1884), Alexander Mitchell Beebe (b.1892), and Sarah Katharine Beebe (born c.1890s).

Beebe, Sarah Katharine - born c.1890s; date of death unknown. Granddaughter of Daniel Quimby Mitchell and Sarah F. Mitchell (1829-1906). Sarah Mitchell's maiden name was Sarah Frost Prior. She married (first) Henry P. Halstead (?-1850) and they had one daughter, Adelaide T. (Halstead) Rushmore (1849-?), who was the mother of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. (1883-1976). Sarah married (second) Daniel Quimby Mitchell; he had three daughters—Addie, Jennie, and Marianna—from his first marriage, which was to Henry P. Halstead's sister. Daniel and Sarah had three children: Henry (b.1854), Henrietta (b.1859), and Caroline (b.1863). Henrietta married Dr. J.H. Beebe in 1886 and they had at least three children: Helen (Beebe) Prouty (born c.1884) Alexander Mitchell Beebe (b.1892), and Sarah Katharine Beebe (born c.1890s).

Bogart, Ethelene (Townsend) – born pre-1900; date of death unknown. She married Dr. Joseph Bogart. They had a daughter, Ethelene Townsend Bogart (d.1920), who married Samuel J. Seaman, Jr. (b.1883) in Roslyn, N.Y., in 1910. Samuel J. Seaman, Jr. and Ethelene Townsend Bogart had a son, Harry Bogart Seaman (b.1911).

Boone, Gage – born c.1985. Son of James (1946-) and Merry Boone. Great-nephew of Leon A., Jr. and Caroline J. “Carly” (Jackson) Rushmore.

Boone, James – born 1946. Resides in Springfield, MA. Son of William A. Boone (born c.1908) and Ruth Wilson Jackson (b.1908). He has one brother, William D. Boone (1943-). James married Merry (last name unknown); they have two sons, Gage (c.1985-) and Wilson (c.1987-). Nephew of Leon A., Jr. and Caroline J. “Carly” (Jackson) Rushmore.

Boone, Ruth Wilson (Jackson) – born 1908. Daughter of Arthur Conrad Jackson (b.1879) and Edith M. Wilson (b.1878). Graduate of Swarthmore College (1930). Her sisters were Caroline “Carly” Alberta (Jackson) Rushmore (1909-2007), Edith Wilson (Jackson) Walter (b.1912), and Elizabeth Wilson (Jackson) Kamp (b.1915). She married William A. Boone (born c.1908) in 1932; they had two sons, William Daniel (1943-) and James (1946-).

Boone, William A. – born c.1908. Graduate of Swarthmore College (1930). He married Ruth Wilson Jackson (b.1908) in 1932; they had two sons, William Daniel Boone (1943-) and James Boone (1946-). Brother-in-law of Leon A., Jr. and Caroline J. “Carly” (Jackson) Rushmore.

Boone, William Daniel – born 1943. Son of William A. Boone (born c.1908) and Ruth Wilson Jackson (b.1908). He has one brother, James Boone (1946-). Nephew of Leon A., Jr. and Caroline J. “Carly” (Jackson) Rushmore.

Boone, Wilson – born c.1987. Son of James (1946-) and Merry Boone. Great-nephew of Leon A., Jr. and Caroline J. “Carly” (Jackson) Rushmore.

Borton, Alice – born in Woodstown, N.J., in 1881; died in 1961. She was a daughter of Society of Friends minister Joel Borton (1854-1927) and Mary E. Wallace.

Borton, Joel – born 1854; died 1927. He lived in Woodstown, N.J., where he was a Society of Friends minister. He was married to Mary E. Wallace.

Bowne, Herbert Sidney – born 1878; died 1951. Son of Sidney Breese Bowne (1849-1915) and Martha “Mattie” Valentine Willets (b.1850). He had two brothers who died as infants, William F. Bowne (1875-1875) and R. Frederick Bowne (1877-1877). He was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Bowne, Martha “Mattie” Valentine (Willets) – born at Jericho, N.Y., in 1850; date of death unknown. Daughter of William S. Willets (1822-1864) and Mary Valentine (1823-1891). Her sisters were Matilda “Tillie” (Willets) Seaman (1854-1896), first wife of Samuel J. Seaman, Sr. (1857-1954); Anna W. (Willets) Willits (1848-1924); and Jane R. (Willets) Seaman (1852-1917), 2nd wife of Samuel J. Seaman, Sr. She married Sidney Breese Bowne (1849-1915); they had three children: William F. (died as an infant in 1875), R. Frederick (died as an infant in 1877), and Herbert Sidney (1878-1951). She was an aunt of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Bowne, J.T. (James Tebbins?) – born 1848; date of death unknown. Most likely a brother of Sidney Breese Bowne (1849-1915), husband of Martha “Mattie” Valentine (Willets) Bowne (b.1850), who was an aunt of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Bowne, Sidney Breese – of Glen Cove, N.Y. - born 1849; died 1915. He married Martha “Mattie” Valentine Willets (b.1850), daughter of Mary Valentine (1823-1891) and William S. Willets (1822-1864). They had three children: William F. Breese (died as an infant in 1875), R. Frederick Breese (died as an infant in 1877), and Herbert Sidney Breese (1878-1951). Martha “Mattie” Valentine Willets was an aunt of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Canby, Laura B. – born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Carle, Elizabeth?– born c.1840s. Married John Carle; they had at least one child, Robert “Robbie” Willets Carle (born c.1860s).

Carle, Robert “Robbie” Willets – born c.1860s. Son of John and Elizabeth? Carle.

Clark, Amelia (Hicks) – born in Westbury, N.Y., in 1859; died in East Williston, N.Y., in 1934. Daughter of Stephen R. Hicks (1823-1892) and Hannah Underhill (1825-1916). Her siblings were Thomas Hicks (1852-1886), Phebe (Hicks) Post (b.1855), Emily Hicks (1860-1864), Mary P. Hicks (1863-1930), and Julia Hicks (1867-1938). Married George E. Clark in 1891; they had at least one child, Tacy (Clark) Jackson.

Cocks, Augustus - born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Cocks, Libby – born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Coles, Edward – possibly Edward F. Coles (1824-1899), son of Henry Coles (1778-1850) and Martha Frost (1793-1875). Written on the back of the cabinet card bearing his image was the word “artist.”

Coles, Martha (Frost) – born 1793 in NYC; died 1875. She was a daughter of Caleb Frost and Sarah Halstead (1761-1831). Her brother Gideon Frost (1798-1880) was the founder of Friends Academy. She was related to both Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. and Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore through different family lines.

Crosby, Mrs. (first name unknown) – born pre-1900. She was a neighbor of the Samuel J. Seaman, Sr. family when they lived on Duck Pond Rd. in Glen Cove, N.Y. (after 1890).

Eastment, Caroline “Carrie” (Titus) – born c.1879; died 1948. Daughter of Elwood Valentine Titus (b.1853) and Maria Louise Cox. Cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Emory, Esther (Hicks) - of Westbury, N.Y. - born 1902; died 2004. Daughter of Henry Hicks (1870-1954), owner and operator of Hicks Nurseries in Westbury, N.Y., and Caroline Jackson. She graduated from Friends Academy, Locust Valley, N.Y., and Swarthmore College, Swarthmore, PA. She worked as a teacher and later as a librarian.

Frost, Gideon – born in Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1798; died in Matinecock, N.Y., in 1880. Son of Caleb Frost (1749-1830) and Sarah Halstead (1768-1831). He married Mary Underhill Willets (1803-1847) in 1823. Founded Friends Academy in Locust Valley, N.Y. He was related to both Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. and Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore through different family lines.

Frost, Mary Underhill (Willets) – born 1803; died 1847. She married Gideon Frost (1798-1880), founder of Friends Academy, Locust Valley, N.Y., in 1823. She was related to both Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. and Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore through different family lines.

Griffen, Claire – born pre-1900? Insufficient information available to identify further.

Griffen, Hannah – born c. 1850s - insufficient information available to identify further.

Griffen, Lizzie – born c. 1850s - insufficient information available to identify further.

Halstead, Henry P. – died at sea off the coast of California in 1850. He married Sarah F. Prior (1829-1906); they had one daughter, Adelaide Teresa (Halstead) Rushmore (b.1849). He was a grandfather of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. (Note: Sarah F. Prior remarried to Daniel J. Mitchell in 1853.)

Halsted, Ezekiel, Sr. – born in New Rochelle, N.Y., in 1738; died in Rye, N.Y., in 1805.

Hellen, Caroline “Carly” Jackson (Rushmore) – (as a child she was known as “Jacky”) - born at Roslyn, N.Y., in 1935. Daughter of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr. (1910-2001) and Caroline A. “Carly” Jackson (1909-2007). Her siblings are Mary Lee Rushmore (1934-) and Stephen Rushmore, Sr. (1945-). Graduate of George School, Newtown, PA, and the University of New Hampshire (1957). She married James E. Hellen (c.1935-) in 1958. They lived in New Hampshire; Warwick, R.I.; and then Deerfield, IL. Their three children are James McKinley Hellen (1961-), Scott Rushmore Hellen (1963-), and David Jackson Hellen (1966-). In 1995,

Carly became Executive Director of the Wealshire, an Alzheimer residential facility in Lincolnshire, IL.

Jackson, Edith M. Wilson - born 1878. Resided in Germantown, PA. Graduate of Swarthmore College (1900). Married Arthur Conrad Jackson (b.1879); they had four daughters: Ruth Wilson (Jackson) Boone (b.1908), Caroline “Carly” Alberta (Jackson) Rushmore (1909-2007), Edith Wilson (Jackson) Walter (b.1912), and Elizabeth Wilson (Jackson) Kamp (b.1915). Mother-in-law of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr.

Jackson, Ella (Albertson) – born 1863; died 1952. Daughter of Richard Albertson (1810-1879) and Phebe W. Prior (1824-1902). Her siblings were Sarah Elizabeth (Albertson) Skillen (1845-1909); Benjamin H. Albertson (1848-1872); John Augustus Albertson (1850-1921); Emma (Albertson) Underhill (1853-1937), who married Samuel J. Underhill (1848-1910); Gulielma (Albertson) Freeman (b.1855); and Richard Albertson (1859-1860). She married (first) Eugene F. Robbins in 1887. She married (second) Jacob W. Jackson; they had three children: Stephen F. Jackson (b.1888), Florence (Jackson) Willits (1889-1961), and Harold A. Jackson (b.1893)

Kamp, Elizabeth Jackson – born 1946. Daughter of Robert S. Kamp, Sr. and Elizabeth Wilson Jackson (b.1915). She has one brother, Robert Stephen Kamp, Jr. (1946-). Niece of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr. and Caroline J. "Carly" (Jackson) Rushmore.

Kamp, Elizabeth Wilson (Jackson) – born 1915. Daughter of Arthur Conrad Jackson (b.1879) and Edith M. Wilson (b.1878). Graduate of Swarthmore College (1937). Her sisters were Ruth Wilson (Jackson) Boone (b.1908), Caroline “Carly” Alberta (Jackson) Rushmore (1909-2007), and Edith Wilson (Jackson) Walter (b.1912). She married Robert S. Kellner, Ruth – wife of Fred Kellner; they had at least one daughter, Judith “Judy” Kellner (c.1943-), who married Stephen Rushmore, Sr. (1945-).

Marshall, Nellie Valentine – born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Mitchell, Clarence – born c.1880; date of death unknown. Grandson? of Daniel Quimby Mitchell and Sarah F. (Prior) Halstead Mitchell (1829-1906).

Mitchell, Sarah F. (Prior) Halstead – born 1829; died 1906. Daughter of John Prior (1787-1860) and Elizabeth Frost (1799-1862). Her siblings were Philemon H. Prior (1821-1867), Phebe W. (Prior) Albertson (1826-1885), Henrietta (Prior) Vanden Burg (1831-1884), and James M. Prior (1835-1857). She married (first) Henry P. Halstead (d.1850); they had one daughter, Adelaide T. Rushmore, Sr.

Post, Elizabeth – born 1888; died 1937. Daughter of John W. Post and Phebe Hicks (1855-1923). Her siblings were Arthur Wood Post (1886-1967) and Herbert Post (1884-1918).

Post, Henry – born pre-1900; date of death unknown. Lived in Wheatley, N.Y. Father of Mary, Martha, John, Steven, and William.

Post, Herbert – born 1884; died 1918. Son of John W. Post and Phebe Hicks (1855-1923). His siblings were Arthur Wood Post (1886-1967) and Elizabeth Post (1888-1937).

Post, James – born 1785; died 1870. Son of Henry Post (b.1733) and Mary Titus. He married Phebe Willis (1787-1883) in 1811. Two of their daughters, Caroline (Post) Underhill (1826-1882) and Catharine (Post) Underhill (1833-1922), were the first and second wives, respectively, of Daniel Underhill, Sr. (1826-1899). Daniel Underhill, Sr. was a great-uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. Daniel Underhill, Sr. was a great-uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. Her siblings were Alexander Mitchell Beebee (b.1892) and Sarah Katharine Beebee (born c.1890s). She married Jason Lester Prouty (1886-1936); they had two daughters, Katherine H., and Doris H. (Note: a common alternate spelling for “Beebee” is “Beebe.”)

Purcell?, B.C. – born pre-1900 – Insufficient information available to identify further.

Raynor, Henry – born 1945. Married Mary Rushmore (1948-) in Greenport, N.Y., in 1970; they had two children, Michael Raynor (1974-) and Kathleen Marie Raynor (1978-).

Raynor, Mary R. – born at Roslyn Heights, N.Y., in 1948. Daughter of Robert Seaman Rushmore, Sr. (1914-) and his second wife, Margaret Marie Hill (1913-1988). Half-sister to Sally (Rushmore) Barbetta (1944-), and sister to Robert Rushmore, Jr. (1950-). Graduate of Friends Academy (1967) and C.W. Post (1971). Married Henry Raynor (1945-) in Greenport, N.Y., in 1970; children are Michael (1974-) and Kathleen Marie (1978-).

Rushmore, Adelaide T. “Addie” (Halstead) – born 1849; date of death unknown. Daughter of Henry P. Halstead (d.1850) and Sarah F. Prior (1829-1906). She married Stephen Thomas Rushmore; they had six children: Thomas H. Rushmore (1880-1955), Halstead Rushmore (1881-1929), Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. (1883-1976), Edna L. Rushmore (1885-1887), Byron Rushmore (1887-1952), and Lillian T. Rushmore (1892-1893). Note: After Henry P. Halstead’s death in 1850, Sarah F. Prior remarried Daniel Quimby Mitchell.

His childhood home in Jericho, N.Y., had at one time been a stop on the Underground Railroad and later became the Maine Maid Inn. His siblings were Mary Seaman (1856-1856), Samuel Jackson Seaman, Sr. (1857-1954), Sarah R. Seaman (1860-1861), Anna Seaman (1861-1944), Robert Seaman (1864-1955), and James Haviland Seaman (1871-1948). He married Margaret Jagger Laurie (1869-1951) in 1893; they had three children: Annie Laurie Seaman (born late 1890s or early 1900s), William Laurie Seaman (1894-1928), and Faith Frances Seaman (1898-1898). In 1917, he served as Oyster Bay town supervisor; in 1918, he became the first mayor-supervisor of Glen Cove, N.Y. When his great nephew H. Bogart Seaman, mayor of Glen Cove, was inducted into the U.S. Army in 1942,

Seaman was called upon to again serve as mayor. He was an uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Seaman, William Laurie – born 1894; died 1928. Son of William Henry Seaman (1868-1954) and Margaret Jagger Laurie (1869-1951). His siblings were Annie Laurie Seaman (born late 1890s or early 1900s) and Faith Frances Seaman (1898-1898). He was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Searing, Leonard – birth and death dates unknown. Son of Samuel Searing (1756-1838) and Phoebe Seaman (1771-1846); married Rebecca Albertson (b.1808) in 1844.

Skillen, Sarah (Albertson) – born 1845; died 1909. Daughter of Richard Albertson (1810-1879) and Phebe Willets Prior (1824-1902). Her siblings were Benjamin H. Albertson (1848-1872); John Augustus Albertson (1850-1921); Emma (Albertson) Underhill (1853-1937), who married Samuel J. Underhill (1848-1910); Gulielma (Albertson) Freeman (b.1855); Richard Albertson (1859-1860), and Ella (Albertson) Jackson (1863-1952). She had three daughters: Amelia Skillen, Florence (Skillen) Cloyd, and a third daughter whose first name is illegible on the back of the photograph from which the aforementioned information was obtained.

Sleigh, Mary Jane (Valentine) – born in Roslyn, N.Y., in 1857; died 1942. Daughter of John Titus Valentine (1806-1884) and Elizabeth Mudge (1816-1875). Her siblings were William M. Valentine (1839-1884), Hannah E. Valentine (1850-1857), and Ellwood Valentine (1852-1930). She married Arthur Sleigh (born c.1852) around the year 1885. She was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Thomas, Mary (Willets) – born c. 1820s; date of death unknown. Daughter of Valentine Willets (1797-1895) and Jane Rushmore (b.1796), great aunt of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr. Her sisters were Letitia (Willets) Allis (b.1818), Phebe Rushmore (Willets) Underhill (b.1824), and Sarah (Willets) Barker (born c. 1820s).

Titus, Ann (Valentine) – born 1801; died 1882. She married Joshua Titus (1797-1866).

Titus, Helen – most likely the Helen Titus who was born in Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1876; died 1905. Daughter of Elwood Valentine Titus (b.1853) and Mary Louisa Cocks (b.1851). She was probably a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Titus, John – born 1779; died 1865. Son of John Titus (1743-1816) and Sarah Robbins (1742-1825). He married Sarah Post (1779-1859) in 1802; they had six children: Maria (Titus) Willets (b.1803), Henry Titus (1805-1865), Lydia (Titus) Willets (b.1808), Robert Titus (1811-1848), William Titus (b.1818), and Elizabeth (Titus) Conklin (b.1818).

Titus, Joshua – born 1797; died 1866. Son of Joshua Titus (b.1760) and Hannah Titus (1766-1849). His siblings were Phebe Titus (1786-1865), Mary (Titus) Kirk (1788-1871), and Sarah Titus (b.1794). He married Ann Valentine (1801-1882).

Titus, Martha – possibly the Martha Titus born 1833; died 1896. Married Benjamin Hicks (1832-1891) in 1852; they had four children: Joshua W. (1855-1856), Mary (1860-1880), Joshua T. (1861-1928), and Joseph W. (c.1875-1886).

Titus, Sarah (Post) – born 1779; died 1859. Daughter of Henry Post. She married John Titus (1779-1865) in 1802; they had six children: Maria (Titus) Willets (b.1803), Henry Titus (1805-1865), Lydia (Titus) Willets (b.1808), Robert Titus (1811-1848), William Titus (b.1818), and Elizabeth (Titus) Conklin (b.1818).

Trapnell, Edna Sarah (Valentine) – born in Brookhaven, N.Y., in 1882; died 1971. Daughter of Jacob Lewis Valentine and Sarah Baldwin Barteau. She married and was later divorced from Thomas Tidball Trapnell. She was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Tredwell, Harriet – born late 19th or early 20th century. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Underhill, Adonijah – born 1800; died 1854; Son of Daniel Underhill (1763-1840) and Mary Jackson. His siblings were Amy (Underhill) Willets (1795-1881) and Samuel J. Underhill (1797-1868), both of whom were great grandparents of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. He married Phebe Hicks (1804-1852) in 1826.

Underhill, Caroline (Post) – born 1826; died 1882. Daughter of James Post (1785-1870) and Phebe Willis (1787-1883). Her siblings were Elisabeth Post (1813-1858), Sarah Post (b.1815), Charles Post (b.1818), Rachel Post (b.1820), Mary (Post) Lewis (1823-1851), Esther (Post) Jackson (b.1829), and Catharine (Post) Underhill (1833-1922). She married Daniel Underhill, Sr. (1826-1899) in 1847; they had two sons: Samuel J. (1848-1910) and James (1851-1859). She died in 1882 and Daniel, a great-uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore, then married Caroline's sister Catharine in 1883. Her cousins Lydia Post (1789-1841) and Edmond Post (1792-1832) married Isaac Rushmore (1788-1875) and Mary Rushmore (1794-1875), respectively. Isaac and Mary were ancestors of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr.

Underhill, Catharine (Post) – possibly also known as “Kate” - was born in 1833; died 1922. Daughter of James Post (1785-1870) and Phebe Willis (1787-1883). Her siblings were Elisabeth Post (1813-1858), Sarah Post (b.1815), Charles Post (b.1818), Rachel Post (b.1820), Mary (Post) Lewis (1823-1851), Caroline (Post) Underhill (1826-1882), and Esther (Post) Jackson (b.1829). She married widower Daniel Underhill, Sr. (1826-1899), a great-uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore, in 1883; his first wife, Caroline (Post) Underhill, was Catharine's sister. Her cousins Lydia Post (1789-1841) and Edmond Post (1792-1832) married Isaac Rushmore (1788-1875) and Mary Rushmore (1794-1875), respectively. Isaac and Mary were ancestors of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr.

Underhill, Daniel, Sr. – born 1826; died 1899. Son of Samuel Jackson Underhill (1797-1868) and Mary Willets (1801-1878). He had one sister, Phebe (Underhill) Seaman (1830-1903), paternal grandmother of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. He married (first) Caroline Post (1826-1882) and they had two sons, Samuel J. Underhill (1848-1910) and James Underhill (1851-1859). He married (second) Catharine Post (1833-1922), Caroline's sister (1833-1922),

in 1883. He was a great-uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. His wife's cousins Lydia Post (1789-1841) and Edmond Post (1792-1832) married Isaac Rushmore (1788-1875) and Mary Rushmore (1794-1875), respectively. Isaac and Mary were ancestors of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr.

Underhill, Daniel, Jr. – born 1874; date of death unknown. Son of Samuel J. Underhill (1848-1910) and Emma Albertson (1853-1937). He had one brother, Henry W. Underhill (b.1882). He was the grandson of Daniel Underhill, Sr. (1826-1899), who was a great-uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. His grandmother Caroline (Post) Underhill (1826-1882) was a cousin of Lydia Post (1789-1841) and Edmond Post (1792-1832), who were married to Isaac Rushmore (1788-1875) and Mary Rushmore (1794-1875), respectively. Isaac and Mary were ancestors of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr.

Underhill, Emma (Albertson) - born 1853; died 1937. Daughter of Richard Albertson (b.1810) and Phebe Willets Prior (1824-1902). Her siblings were Sarah Elizabeth (Albertson) Skillen (1845-1909), Benjamin H. Albertson (1848-1872), John Augustus Albertson (1850-1921), Gulielma (Albertson) Freeman (b.1855), Richard Albertson (1859-1860), and Ella (Albertson) Jackson (1863-1952). She married Samuel J. Underhill (1848-1910); they had two sons, Daniel Underhill (b.1874) and Henry W. Underhill (b.1882). Her father-in-law, Daniel Underhill, Sr. (1826-1899), was a great uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. Her mother-in-law, Caroline (Post) Underhill (1826-1882), was a cousin of Lydia Post (1789-1841) and Edmond Post (1792-1832), who were married to Isaac Rushmore (1788-1875) and Mary Rushmore (1794-1875), respectively. Isaac and Mary were ancestors of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr.

Underhill, James – born 1851; died 1859. He was the son of Daniel Underhill, Sr. (1826-1899) and Caroline Post (1826-1882). He had one brother, Samuel J. Underhill (1848-1910). His father was a great uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. His mother was a cousin of Lydia Post (1789-1841) and Edmond Post (1792-1832), who were married to Isaac Rushmore (1788-1875) and Mary Rushmore (1794-1875), respectively. Isaac and Mary were ancestors of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr.

Underhill, Maria – insufficient information available to identify further.

Underhill, Samuel J. - born 1848; died 1910. Son of Daniel Underhill, Sr. (1826-1899) and Caroline Post (1826-1882). He had one brother, James Underhill (1851-1859). Samuel married Emma Albertson (1853-1937) in 1872; they had two sons, Daniel Underhill (b.1874) and Henry W. Underhill (b.1882). His father was a great uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore. His mother was a cousin of Lydia Post (1789-1841) and Edmond Post (1792-1832), who were married to Isaac Rushmore (1788-1875) and Mary Rushmore (1794-1875), respectively. Isaac and Mary were ancestors of Leon A. Rushmore, Sr.

Valentine, Anna C. (Thorne) – born c.1822; died 1889. Daughter of Samuel Cock Thorne and Maria Hoogland. She married Lewis Valentine (1829-1912), great uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Valentine, Anna H. - insufficient information available to identify further.

Valentine, Ellwood – born in Roslyn, N.Y. in 1852; died in Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1930. Son of John Titus Valentine (1806-1884) and Elizabeth Mudge (1816-1875). His siblings were William M. Valentine (1839-1884), Hannah E. Valentine (1850-1857), and Mary Jane (Valentine) Sleigh (1857-1942). He was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Valentine, Jane – born pre-1850. Identified only as “grandmother of Charles and Nellie.”

Valentine, Jane R. – born in Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1834; died 1882. Daughter of Jacob Valentine (c.1791-1868) and Martha Titus (c.1791-1880). Her siblings were Charles V. (b.1815), Lewis [1] (1820-1821), Mary (Valentine) Willets (1822-1864), and Lewis [2] (1829-1912). She was a great aunt of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Valentine, Jacob - of Glen Cove, N.Y. – born c.1791; died 1868. He married Martha Titus (1791-1880); they had six children: Charles V. (b.1815), Lewis [1] (1820-1821), Mary (Valentine) Willets (1822-1864), Ann (b.1825), Lewis [2] (1829-1912), and Jane R. (1834-1882). He was a great grandfather of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Valentine, Lewis [2] – born 1829; died 1912. Son of Jacob Valentine (c.1791-1868) and Martha Titus (c.1791-1880). His siblings were Charles V. (b.1815), Lewis [1] (1820-1821), Mary (Valentine) Willets (1822-1864), Ann (b.1825), and Jane R. (1834-1882). He married Anna C. Thorne. (c.1822-1889) in 1861 in Oyster Bay, N.Y. He was a great uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Valentine, Martha (Titus) – born 1791; died in Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1880. Married Jacob Valentine (c.1791-1868) in 1814; they had six children: Charles V. (b.1815), Lewis [1] (1820-1821), Mary (Valentine) Willets (1822-1864), Ann (b.1825), Lewis [2] (1829-1912), and Jane R. (1834-1882). She was a great grandmother of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Valentine, Sarah (African American) – born prior to 1870. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Walter, Edith Wilson (Jackson) – born 1912. Daughter of Arthur Conrad Jackson (b.1879) and Edith M. Wilson (b.1878). Graduate of Swarthmore College (1933). Her sisters were Ruth Wilson (Jackson) Boone (b.1908), Caroline “Carly” Alberta (Jackson) Rushmore (1909-2007), and Elizabeth Wilson (Jackson) Kamp (b.1915). She married Joseph H. Walter (born c.1912) in 1934; they had one son, Joseph Jackson Walter, Jr. (1940-). Sister-in-law of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr.

Walter, Joseph H., Sr. – born c.1912. Graduate of Swarthmore College (1933). Married Elizabeth Wilson Jackson (b.1912) in 1934; they had one son, Joseph Jackson Walter, Jr. (1940-). Brother-in-law of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr. and Caroline “Carly” A. (Jackson) Rushmore.

Walter, Joseph Jackson, Jr. – born 1940. Son of Joseph H. Walter, Sr. (born c.1912) and Elizabeth Wilson Jackson (b.1912). Nephew of Leon A. Rushmore, Jr. and Caroline A. "Carly" (Jackson) Rushmore.

Whitson, Maud – born pre-1900? Possibly a descendant of Thomas Whitson (b.1821) and Mary Willets (b.1826); cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willets, Amy – born 1852; date of death unknown. Daughter of Daniel Willets (1824-1884) and Lydia Moore (1830-1904). She had two sisters, Charlotte Willets (b.1854) and Hannah (Willets) Seaman (1858-1896), and possibly a third, Mary Willets (b.1861). She was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willets, Amy (Underhill) – born 1795; died 1881. Daughter of Daniel Underhill (1763-1840) and Mary Jackson. Her siblings were Samuel J. Underhill (1797-1868) and Adonijah J. Underhill (1800-1854). She married Isaac Willets (1794-1855); they had seven children: John Willets (b.1819), William S. Willets (1822-1864), Daniel Willets (1824-1884), Mary (Willets) Whitson (b.1826), Elizabeth Willets (b.1829), Phebe (Willets) Frame (b.1832), and Hannah (Willets) Robbins (b.1836). She was a great grandmother of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willets, Charlotte "Lottie" Moore - born 1854; date of death unknown. She was a daughter of Daniel Willets (1824-1884) and Lydia Moore (1830-1904). She had two sisters, Amy Willets (b.1852) and Hannah (Willets) Seaman (1858-1896), and possibly a third, Mary Willets (b.1861). She was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willets, Daniel – born 1824; died 1884. Son of Isaac Willets (1794-1855) and Amy Underhill (1795-1881). He married Lydia Moore (1830-1904) and they had two daughters, Charlotte Moore Willets (b.1854) and Hannah (Willets) Seaman (1858-1896), and possibly a third, Mary Willets (b.1861). Hannah married Robert Seaman (1864-1955), uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willets, Hannah [T?] - born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify.

Willets, Henry T. – born 1812; died 1888. Son of Samuel Willets (1763-1850) and Hannah Seaman (b.1776). His siblings were Isaac Willets (1794-1855), Robert Willets (1797-1797), William Willets (b.1798), Mary (Willets) Underhill (1801-1878), Andrew Willets (b.1804), Jane P. Willets (1806-1864), Esther Willets (1809-1888), and Hannah Willets (1818-1896). He was a great uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willets, Joseph - born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Willets, Lydia (Moore) – born 1830; died 1904. She married Daniel Willets (1824-1888); they had two daughters, Charlotte (Moore) Willets (b.1854) and Hannah (Willets) Seaman (1858-1896), and possibly a third, Mary Willets (b.1861). Willets, Mary (Valentine) – born in Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1823; died 1891. Daughter of Jacob Valentine (c.1791-1868) and Martha Titus (c.1791-1880). She married William S. Willets

(1822-1864) and they had four daughters: Matilda (Willets) Seaman (1854-1896), first wife of Samuel J. Seaman, Sr. (1857-1954); Anna W. (Willets) Willits (1848-1924); Jane R. Willets, William S. – born 1822; died 1864. Son of Isaac Willets (1794-1895) and Amy Underhill (1795-1881). Willis, Phebe – born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Willits, Anna W. (Willets) – born 1848; died 1924. Daughter of Mary Valentine (1823-1891) and William S. Willets (1822-1864). She married Frederick E. Willits (1846-1923) in Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1873; they had four children: Everett F. Willits (1874-1902); Martha V. Willits (1876-1882); Elizabeth E. “Bessie” Willits (1877-1903), who died in Venice, Italy, and is buried in the Matinecock Friends Burial Ground, Locust Valley, N.Y.; and James Willits (1880-1967). Willits, Elizabeth E. “Bessie” – born 1877; died 1903. Daughter of Frederick E. Willits (1846-1923) and Anna W. Willets (1848-1924). Her siblings were Everett F. Willits (1874-1902), Martha V. Willits (1876-1882), and James Willits (1880-1967). She died in Venice, Italy, and is buried in the Matinecock Friends Burial Ground, Locust Valley, N.Y. She was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willits, Frederick E. – born 1846; died 1923. Son of James R. Willits (born pre-1830; date of death unknown). He married Anna W. Willets (1848-1924) in Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1873.

They had four children: Everett F. Willits (1874-1902); Martha V. Willits (1876-1882); Elizabeth E. "Bessie" Willits (1877-1903), who died in Venice, Italy, and is buried in the Matinecock Friends Burial Ground, Locust Valley, N.Y.; and James Willits (1880-1967). He was an uncle of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willits, James – born at Glen Cove, N.Y., in 1880; died 1967. Son of Frederick E. Willits (1846-1923) and Anna W. Willets (1848-1924). His siblings were Everett F. Willits (1874-1902); Martha V. Willits (1876-1882); and Elizabeth E. "Bessie" Willits (1877-1903), who died in Venice, Italy, and is buried in the Matinecock Friends Burial Ground, Locust Valley, N.Y. He was a cousin of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willits, James R. – born pre-1830; date of death unknown. Father of Frederick E. Willits (1846-1923), who married Anna W. Willets, aunt of Mary Willets (Seaman) Rushmore.

Willits, Mary V. – Insufficient information available to identify further. Possibly misidentified – may be Martha V. Willits (1876-1882).

Wintingham, Helen E. – born c.1863. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Unknown last name, Betty (African American) – born pre-1900. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Unknown last name, Eda – born late 19th or early 20th century. Insufficient information available to identify further.

Unknown last name, Jacob (African American) – born pre-1900. Jacob worked for the Samuel J. Seaman, Sr. family when they lived on Duck Pond Rd. in Glen Cove, N.Y.
